Change in the Chair: Hortensia von Roda to succeed Toni Schönenberger

Dr. Toni Schönenberger is stepping down after 10 years as Chair of the Association for the Promotion of SIK-ISEA and as Vice-President of the SIK-ISEA Foundation. He played a key role in the development of SIK-ISEA and his vigorous devotion to acquiring third-party funding has been a tremendous aid in these economically challenging times. We are profoundly grateful to Toni Schönenberger for our excellent partnership and we wish him a fulfilling continuation to his future professional and personal life.

We are pleased to announce that the Association elected **Dr. Hortensia von Roda** as its new Chair during the General Assembly on 12 June 2014. Hortensia von Roda studied art history, ethnology and archaeology at the Universities of Zurich and Fribourg. Her career took her from assistant positions at the Museum Villa Stuck in Munich and the Department of Prints and Drawings in Basel's public art collection to the Museum zu Allerheiligen in Schaffhausen, where she has curated the Graphische Sammlung since 1988. From 1993 until 1999 Hortensia von Roda chaired the Basler Kunstverein, and from 1996 to 2004 she served on the University Council of Basel University. Since 1995 she has been managing director and a trustee of the Sturzenegger-Stiftung in Schaffhausen.
